Dear Friends,

It's hard to believe this year is almost over! So much has happened with much more coming.

We just finished our 2023 Annual MDP Board Meeting. It was exciting to listen to our Kenya Administrator, Ogoti Kenani, give his report on the ongoing progress in Maasailand.

Our Lay Pastors have been busy sharing the Gospel, organizing new churches, holding baptismal studies, as well as weekly Sabbath Services. We are happy to tell you that as of this date money for the 18th church has just been sent over!! That only leaves 5 more churches to finish in 2023 at \$5,000 per church. The building crew has been busy, as it only takes them 4 - 5 days to complete a church building that includes flooring, windows, and doors. The progress has brought great excitement and encouragement to the church members who have been worshiping under trees for so many years. Each church group has also contributed Kenya Shillings, 50,000/= (\$370) towards the building costs, which helps them to take ownership as well.

One of our biggest needs right now is to hire 6 more Lay Pastors. This also means that we need 6 more motorcycles for them, plus 2 for current lay pastors that still do not have one. Each motorcycle is \$1,300. The needs and requests keep coming for more workers. The weekly radio program is a big part of this ongoing growth. More and more people are calling the radio station, and our Lay Pastor radio presenters, with questions and asking for someone to come to their area to teach them.

We just had four more girls finish their technical certificates. This makes our work fulfilling to watch the girls go into the work force and contribute to their families and villages. One of our first girls that we took in when we opened MDPEC, Eshter Ngoshosh, has just been made Ward Administrator in Narok County, answering directly to the Governor. More specifically, Esther is stationed in the Sub-County of Melili, where she and her three siblings were found living as orphans in a cardboard hut, digging potatoes to survive. Esther excelled all through school, and graduated from Baroton University. Esther has worked hard and she is a wonderful example for the younger girls to reach their goals if they work hard.


This is all possible only with God's help and guidance and from the generous donations and support from all our friends and sponsors. We thank everyone of you for your part in assisting MDP, reaching the unentered areas of Maasailand, and spreading the Gospel of our Jesus.
